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


Start FrontDoor Verification

Step 1


To join our Spark Good nonprofit community, your organization needs to be a FrontDoor verified organization.

Visit <u>FrontDoor</u>, powered by CyberGrants to start the verification process.

Create Walmart.com Account

Step 2


After your organization is verified, create/or use a Walmart.com account with the same email address that you use to log into your FrontDoor account. Note: These are two separate accounts using the same email address. Please wait **24 hours** after verification to visit Step 3.



Your organization name should appear. Click your organization name to continue.




Explore the nonprofit portal






What type of organization are you?

It depends on your organization's tax status.

How do you know your organization's tax status and classification?

- (1) Your organization may have a determination letter from the United States Internal Revenue Service (IRS) that provides your tax status and classification (i.e. you are a public charity or a private foundation).
- (2) You can visit www.guidestar.com, IRS Tax Exempt Organization Database Search Tool (https://apps.irs.gov/app/eos/) or NCES databases (www.nces.ed.gov/datatools) and do a search.
